Executive Summary

Orange County Public Schools is the ninth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

Mission: With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

School Collection Development Plan

Laureate Park Elementary School serves 1049 students enrolled in Kindergarten through fifth grades. The student population's ethnicity is made up of 40% Hispanic and 60% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 73% White, 7% Black, 0% Native, 11% Asian, 1% Pacific, and 7% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Suzanne Workum and Assistant Principal Kathleen Ramsey. Laureate Park Elementary School is proud to offer many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include National Honor Society, Battle of the Books, Recycling, Reading, Dance and Choir Clubs. As well as Student Government, patrols and news crew.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Laureate Park Elementary School indicates that the average age of the collection is 2014 and the number of books per student is 9. The [American Association for School Libraries](#) has established a criteria for a highly effective media center that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection.

At this time, Laureate Park Elementary School does not meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- Students in this school improved on the state achievement tests.
- Our school's Hispanic population is 40%, in order to meet the needs of these students we will need to focus on purchasing new books on Hipanic Heritage.
- The average publication date of 2014 is acceptable.
- This collection contains many of the titles suggested by the DOE list and the new B.E.S.T. Standards suggested readings.
- Our students also have access to 1,117 eBooks, audiobooks, and digital magazines available in SORA.
- Weeding will focus on the OCPS Catalog Project expectations as well as aged titles in fiction and/or nonfiction.

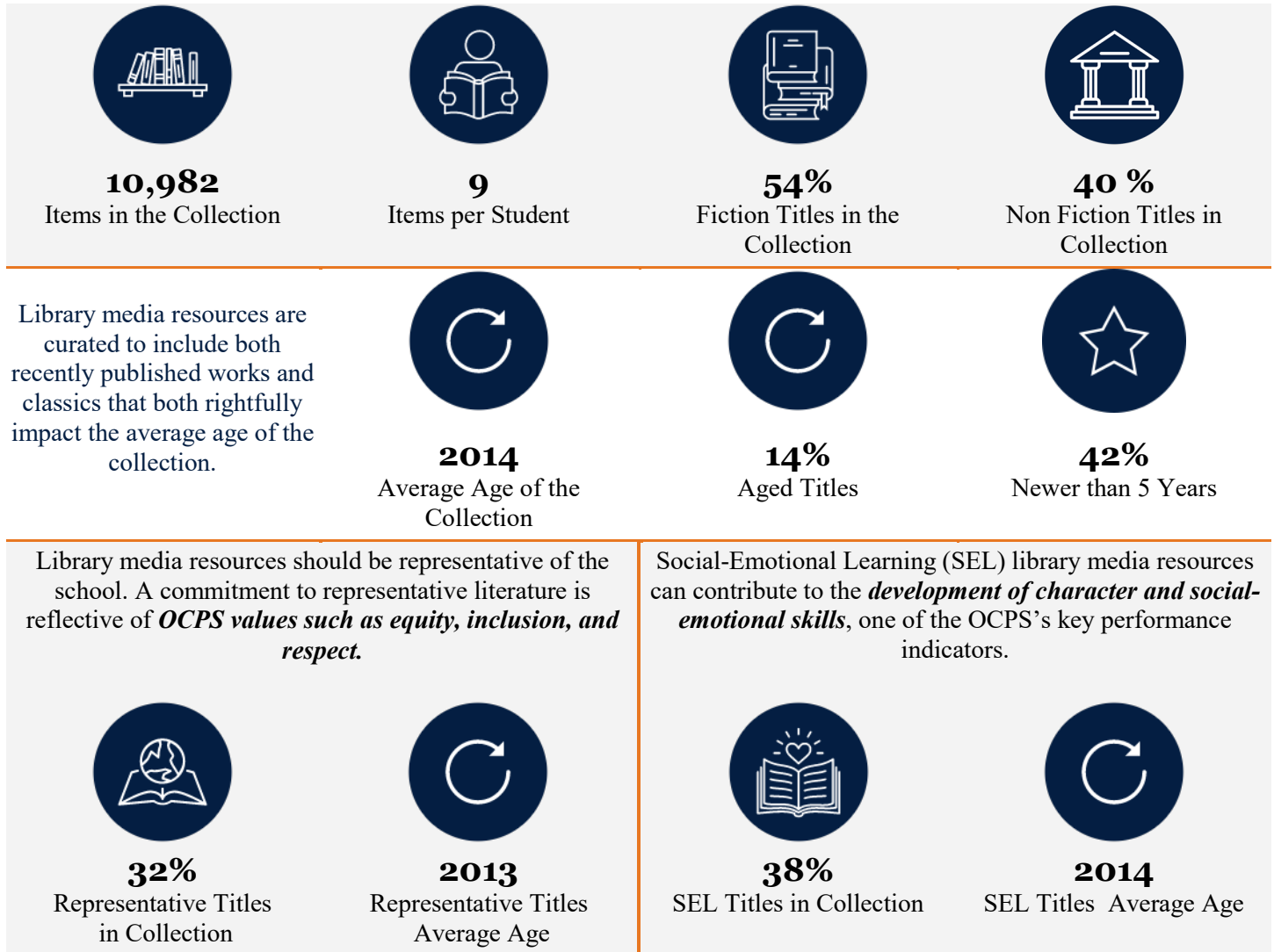

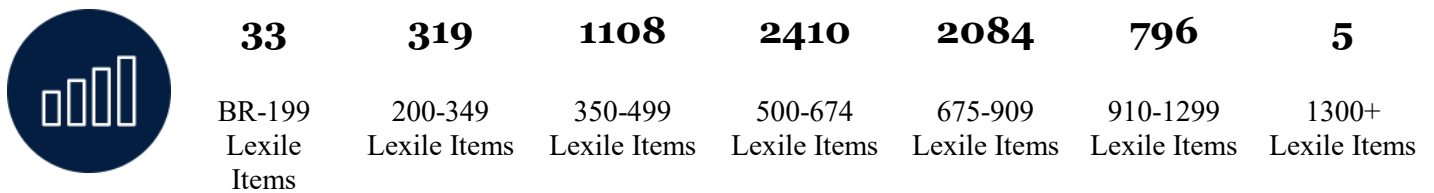

- We need to update the religious category because we have virtually no books there.
- We need to update our biographies.
- We need more computer science/technology books.
- We need more philosophy books.
- We have grown our science category books.
- We have also improved our graphic novels from 5 when the school opened to 544.

Representation Analysis

To deepen focus on strategic collection development, specific sections of the collection were analyzed in detail to determine whether the media center collection reflects and represents various points of view and experiences. The goal is to provide a balanced collection that can be both a mirror, to reflect a reader's experience, and a window, so readers can experience different viewpoints.

Results

Based on the available school data of Laureate Park Elementary School in comparison to Collection Analysis results, it was found that:

Summary

After completing a deeper, targeted analysis of the representation section of the TitleWise report, it was determined that:

- Hispanic students are 40% of the school's population. However, we only have 100 titles written in Spanish or about Hispanic characters and only 1% of the characters or biographies feature Hispanic people.
- The average publication date for Hispanic books in our school is 2013 which is above what is expected.
