



Scott Drabczyk, Athletic Director

We are excited to announce Mr. Scott Drabczyk as the new Director of Athletics for 113-H-SW-4 High School! A fifteen year veteran of interscholastic athletic administration, Scott is returning to Orange County Public Schools after serving the last seven years as the Assistant Principal for Athletics, Facilities, and Student Services at Father Lopez Catholic High School in Daytona Beach. Prior to his tenure at Father Lopez he served as the Director of Athletics at Ocoee High School (2010-2014) as well as the Assistant Athletic Director, Head Golf Coach, and Assistant Baseball Coach at Dr. Phillips High School (2006-2010).

In addition to his duties on campus, Drabczyk has had the honor of serving as the President of the Florida Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (2017-2018), and currently serves as the organizations Past-President and chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee. His work also extends to the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association working as the committee chairman for the national Hall of Fame Committee as well as a member of the associations delegate assembly. Drabczyk has previously served on the state level as part of the FHSAA's Representative Assembly, Athletic Director Advisory Committee, Officials Compensation Task Force, and International Student Task Force. He is currently a state and national faculty member for the NIAAA's Leadership Training Institute. A 2005 graduate of Bethune-Cookman University, Drabczyk was a four year college athlete competing in Men's Golf. He earned his masters degree in Educational Leadership from Stetson University in 2011 as well as his Certified Athletic Administrator designation from the NIAAA in 2010.
