

Site 113-H-W-4 FAQs

1. How do I know if I am zoned for this school?

Currently our school has 4 zoning options under consideration. You can access the zoning options here at [Zoning Options Link](#). The process for zoning approval will continue at the September 15th, 2020 school board meeting. All school board meetings and sessions are open to the public.

2. Do I need to register for the new school?

If you are a current student at one of our feeder schools and will be zoned for our school you will not need to enroll with our school. Our guidance team will visit our feeder schools (including Bridgewater MS, Horizon West MS, and Windermere HS) in Spring in order to facilitate course registration. There is nothing that students or parents need to do before that.

3. When will counselors be available to discuss course selections?

Counselors will visit feeder schools including Bridgewater MS, Horizon West MS, and Windermere HS in order to conduct the course registration process. Counselors will visit each school at least twice, once to facilitate presentations or meetings with students and another to individually meet with students to discuss their course selection. Classroom visits and meetings will be facilitated from January through April. A schedule will be posted prior to the meetings. We will also facilitate parent nights at our feeder schools in early Spring of 2021.

4. Is there a course directory or curriculum guide available for review?

Our curriculum guide will be posted to our website in early Spring.

5. When will the school open?

School will open to students in August of 2021.

6. When will I know my schedule for 21-22?

It is anticipated that you will be able to access your schedule in August of 2021.

7. How do I get a schedule change?

If there is a concern or issue with your schedule you can email your counselor at their firstname.lastname@ocps.net. Counselors email addresses will be posted to our website.

8. What if you don't offer a class I need?

If you are interested in taking a class that we do not offer you should reach out to your counselor to discuss options including alternative courses or options.

9. Will you offer Cambridge (AICE) courses and Advanced Placement courses?

We will offer a variety of both AICE/Cambridge as well as Advanced Placement courses. A complete list of courses will be available through our curriculum guide which will be posted on our website in early Spring.

10. Will our school offer ROTC?

We will offer a similar program through The National Defense Cadet Corps (NDCC); the NDCC is similar to the Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (JROTC) except that it is

fully funded by schools that choose to pursue a JROTC unit without financial assistance from the Department of Defense.

11. How do I sign up for athletics?

Athletic activities require students to have a current physical form submitted annually in order to participate and try out. Our athletic director will be posting information related to sports on our website starting in late Spring. We anticipate that we will participate in Spring football, all other sports will begin in Fall of 2021.

12. Is the football field on campus?

Our football field is located on our campus.

13. When will we have a name, mascot, and school colors?

The process for selecting a name, mascot, and school colors has begun and will continue through the fall. The first step of this process is to collect community input on name. We encourage community members to complete the initial naming survey at [Site 113-H-W-4 Naming Survey 1](#). The deadline to submit this survey is September 14th, 2020.

14. Which grade levels will be at the new school?

The new school will serve grades 9-12, however only 9th through 11th graders will attend during the 2021-2022 school year. Seniors will remain at Windermere HS during that year.
