Title I funds and programs enhance the campus through parental involvement programs, professional development and student support and instruction.

Title X	McKinney Vento Program provides support to our homeless students. The district provides professional development regarding Homeless programs. Information is disseminated to our school through the SAFE coordinator and Title I programming as well. Programs are implemented to help identify needs and to provide information and assistance with the highest degree of confidentiality. Our SAFE homeless program includes: free backpacks and supplies to our coded students, uniforms, clothes, resources to housing programs, school fees are waived, immediate enrollment, school of origin, and free transportation. For our seniors, college application fees are waived, and the first semester in any Florida college is free.
Supplemental Academic Instructions (SAI)	Our academic intervention programs are used to provide our level I and II students with remediation in reading, math, and science and with supplies, materials and additional academic instruction.
Nutrition Program	All students are provided provide daily with free breakfast. A food pantry is located on campus for students and families to use at any time. Safe provides lunch items for those students not eligible for free or reduced lunch and are unable to bring money
