



# Kindergarten Supply List for 2021-2022

Supplies should be purchased by the first day of school on August 10th. Bring all items in a large brown bag with your child's name written on the outside.

Please have your child's name on the following items only: backpack, school box, scissors, agenda, and lunchbox. Please note that the rest of the supplies will be used on an as needed basis and are shared with the class.

\*\*Note – **Crayola** crayons and markers last the longest and require less replacing!!!

- **\$20.00-** A one-time activity fee for supplies that are not provided by the district to enhance the curriculum throughout the year. (i.e. cooking, crafts, etc.)

Make checks payable to Citrus Elementary.

- Agenda – (purchased at Meet the Teacher \$5.00)
- Backpack (not on wheels)
- 1- plastic pencil/ school supply box
- 4- boxes of **Crayola** crayons (16 or 24 count)
- 10 four packs of glue sticks (students use lots of glue)
- 1- box of baby wipes
- 2- boxes of Kleenex
- 1- pair of **Fiskars** blunt/rounded tip scissors
- **2 primary composition notebook (can be found at Staples or Amazon)**
- 2 regular black and white composition notebook
- 9- pocket and prong folders (plastic only) (2 green, 2 red, 2 yellow, 2 blue)
- 2 bottle of waterless hand sanitizer
- 2 packs of large pink erasers
- 2- boxes 24 packs of #2 pencils
- 2 box of Ziploc bags (1 gallon and 1 quart size)
- 1 pack paper plates (small)
- **Headphones** (not ear buds as they fall out) labeled and in a ziplock bag.



# Skills for Success



Your child will adapt well to kindergarten if he/she has mastered the following skills by the start of the school year:

- Follows simple 2 to 3 step directions.
- **Is able to follow rules such as:** Raise hand to speak, follow directions first time, stay in seat, and be kind to others
- Stays focused on a task, story, or activity for 15 to 20 minutes.
- Ties shoes.
- Clearly communicates needs.
- Identifies numerals 0-10, counts to 20, and identifies colors and shapes.
- Writes name correctly- Begin name with capital letter and write the rest of the name in lower case letters.

For example: Susie

- Identifies many uppercase and lowercase letters and associates the sounds with those letters.
- Uses bathroom by self.
- Opens lunch items (lids, juice pouches, chip bags, etc.) by self.
