Principal's Report

- The new hurricane dates have been released and it has been decided that October 17th, 2019 will be a school day and students will have a holiday on October 18th, 2019
- Homecoming week starts on the week of September 30th leading up to the dance on October 5th. The theme this year is The Festival.
- The recent talk "What your kids aren't telling you about cellphones and vaping" had a great turnout with many parents. It reached to feeder schools that are now interested in the seminar to be at their schools as well.

Grant Updates:

1. Titan Market - Clancy
 - Grant for \$750.00 to help maintain the Titan Market environment so that it is safe for the food storage. PTSA offered to handle this grant.
2. Agriculture - Tays
 - Grant for supplies to build a coop for pageant chickens on campus. Approximately 200 students would be impacted and it would be used for the next couple of years. This grant was approved for \$833.53 with the contingency that all items must be purchased before the next SAC meeting and Mr. Tays is to provide pictures once the chickens are in their new home.
3. Physics - Morgan
 - Grant for new rotary motion sensors to use with all the physics students. The current sensors are not precise to conduct labs with proper data. Approximately 110 students would benefit as well should last up to ten years. This grant was approved for \$1677.00 but paid in separate payments.
4. Marketing - Benedict
 - Applied for the grant for an online business simulation that cost \$3,596.00 for 30 students. This grant was tabled so the teacher could come back and present it himself to answer a few questions.
5. Social Studies - Elkins
 - Grant for new maps to use in her classes because the current ones in use are inaccurate. It would benefit over 150 students and teachers would share the maps. This grant was approved for \$225.00
