Executive Summary

District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the ninth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

Mission: With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

School Collection Development Plan

Hillcrest Elementary School serves 460 students enrolled in Kindergarten through fifth grades. The student population's ethnicity is made up of 28% Hispanic and 72% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 64% White, 18% Black, 0% Native, 5% Asian, 0% Pacific, and 12% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Stacey Tanenbaum. Hillcrest Elementary School is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include: French and Spanish Language Academies, an active Book Club, and Battle of Books. Because our school is a magnet school, we have students from all over the county. It is a diverse population with a wide range of socio-economic backgrounds. Eighteen percent of Hillcrest students meet the requirements for the Gifted Program.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Hillcrest Elementary School indicates that the average age of the collection is 2010 and the number of books per student is 21. The [American Association for School Libraries](#) has established a criteria for a highly effective media center that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection. At this time, Hillcrest Elementary School does not meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- Because eighteen percent of the student population is gifted, our patrons will require books at a higher lexile than other student populations.
- Because the overwhelming majority of our students are academically proficient, we need to concentrate on material that will provide our patrons with academic enrichment.
- Thirty Two percent of our titles are aged.
- At this time, we don't have data on the number of French and Spanish books available. This is a project that we will be working on. Data will be collected and included soon.

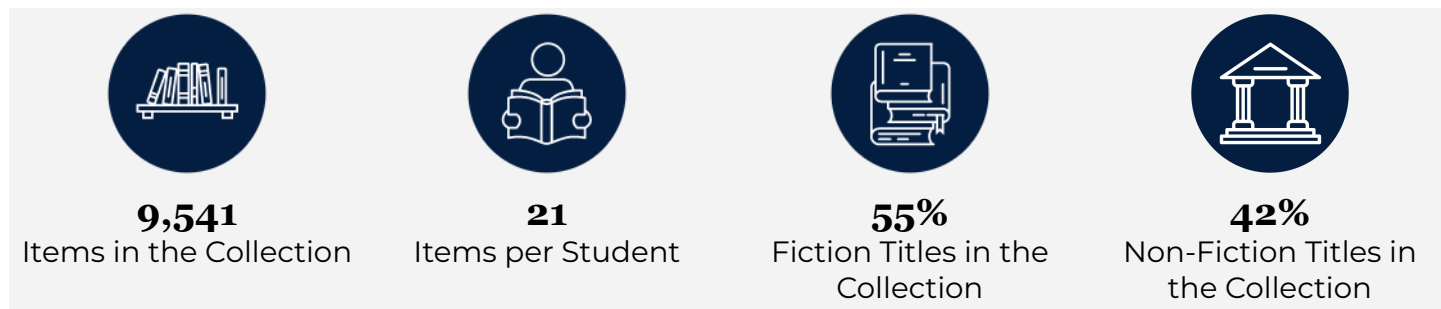

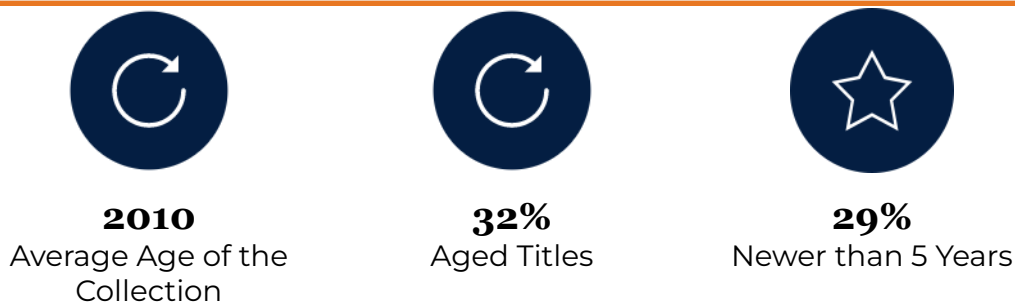

Library media resources are curated to include both recently published works and classics that both rightfully impact the average age of the collection.

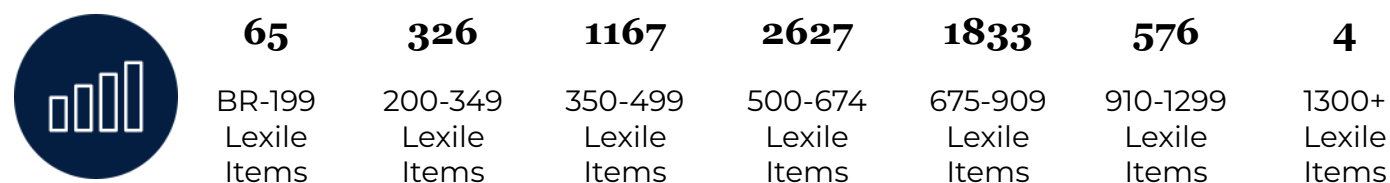


Library media resources should be representative of the school. A commitment to representative literature is reflective of **OCPS values such as equity, inclusion, and respect.**

- Literature, by nature, is older than non-fiction text.
- Science and Technology need to be updated, because it is recommended that books in this category be three years old or less.
- At this time, we don't have data on the number of French and Spanish books available. This is a project that we will be working on. Data will be collected and included soon.

Representation Analysis

To deepen focus on strategic collection development, specific sections of the collection were analyzed in detail to determine whether the media center collection reflects and represents various points of view and experiences. The goal is to provide a balanced collection that can be both a mirror, to reflect a reader's experience, and a window, so readers can experience different viewpoints.

Results

Based on the available school data of Hillcrest Elementary School in comparison to Collection Analysis results, it was found that:

Summary

After completing a deeper, targeted analysis of the representation section of the TitleWise report, it was determined that:

- Our collection requires the purchase of books that adequately represent our Hispanic population.
- Our collection requires the purchase of books that adequately represent the African American population.
- Many students at Hillcrest are multi-racial. Although the data is not available, our collection requires that these patrons be recognized.
